

9 BELGIAN WINEGROWERS PARTICIPATE IN WINE PARIS

With the support of the Association des Vignerons de Wallonie and the ASBL Belgische Wijnbouwers, nine Belgian wineries are participating this year in Wine Paris, a must-attend event for both wine enthusiasts and professionals.

This edition particularly highlights winemakers renowned for the excellence of their sparkling wines, crafted using the traditional method and awarded multiple prestigious medals.

While climate change is a global concern, it has contributed to the growth of high-quality viticulture in Belgium. This trend has accelerated in recent years, leading to a remarkable expansion of vineyard areas. In 2023, Belgian vineyards covered approximately 891 hectares, producing 3.4 million liters of wine, more than half of which was sparkling wine. Belgium now has 290 officially registered winemakers.¹

The Walloon Vineyard: A Pioneer in Organic Viticulture

Beyond the recognized quality of its wines, a distinctive strength of the Walloon vineyard is its commitment to sustainable agriculture. A significant portion of the vineyards is now certified organic, reflecting a strong determination to balance tradition with environmental respect. Currently, 51.4% of vineyard areas are under organic control, thanks to a diverse agricultural ecosystem, lower planting density (reducing the spread of diseases), and greater freedom in selecting more resistant grape varieties. For comparison, the average proportion of organic-certified vineyards in France is 21.5%.

International expansion

Most of the Flemish winemakers participating in Wine Paris 2025 are already experienced in international trade fairs. Some of them were present in 2022 and 2023 at a collective stand during ProWein in Düsseldorf. The previous year, an event was also organized in Amsterdam to introduce foreign markets to the quality and uniqueness of Belgian wines.

The nine participants in this edition of Wine Paris will be present at a shared stand with the Concours Mondial de Bruxelles, located in **Hall 4**, **stand D153**.

WINERY 'VIGNOBLE DES AGAISES - DOMAINE RUFFUS'

The Vignoble des Agaises, also known as Domaine Ruffus, is a Belgian winery located in Haulchin, near Binche, Wallonia. It is recognized as Belgium's largest producer of sparkling wines, covering an area of over 40 hectares.

Situated on a south-facing limestone hillside, the vineyard benefits from ideal conditions for viticulture. The main grape varieties cultivated are Chardonnay, Pinot Noir, and Pinot Meunier, which are used to



produce sparkling wines following the traditional method.

The vineyard was founded in 2002 by a team of passionate professionals: Raymond Leroy, a wine merchant, Etienne Delbeke, a farmer, Thierry Gobillard, a Champagne winemaker

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WINERY 'CHÂTEAU DE BIOUL'

The Château de Bioul is located in the Namur region of Wallonia, within the Côtes de Sambre et Meuse appellation. The Château's vineyard spans approximately 13 hectares, cultivated using organic and biodynamic methods, reflecting a deep commitment to nature and tradition. The grape varieties grown include Johanniter, Solaris, Cabaret Noir, Cabernet Jura, Muscaris, and Pinotin, which are used to produce high-quality red, white, rosé, and sparkling wines.



Since 2006, the Wyckmans-Vaxelaire family has revitalized the estate by planting vines, reconnecting with the region's rich winemaking heritage.

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WINERY CHANT D'EOLE

The Domaine du Chant d'Éole, located in Quévy, near Mons in Belgium, spans 54 hectares. It was established in 2010 through a partnership between a renowned Champagne family and a Belgian landowning-farming family, the Ewbank de Wespin family. Today, the estate is led by Hubert Ewbank, CEO, owner, and co-founder, alongside his uncle, Louis Ewbank, and his cousin, Inès Ewbank. It is now the largest fully family-owned vineyard in Belgium.



The Domaine primarily cultivates Chardonnay (98%), its signature grape variety, as well as Pinot Noir. With south-facing vineyards and chalky soil, the estate benefits from ideal drainage and irrigation conditions for producing sparkling wines using the traditional method. The white chalk soil, which retains moisture in winter and releases it in summer, gives the estate's cuvées their distinctive terroir, similar to that found in the prestigious Champagne houses of the Côte des Blancs in Champagne.

Specializing in traditional-method sparkling wines, Chant d'Éole has gained international acclaim. In 2019, the estate was named International Revelation at the Concours Mondial de Bruxelles, outperforming over 200 Champagnes and 700 sparkling wines, Cavas, and Proseccos. This recognition propelled Chant d'Éole onto the world stage as one of the leading producers of traditional-method sparkling wines. With nearly 100 awards, Domaine du Chant d'Éole is one of the most awarded sparkling wine producers worldwide following the traditional method.

At Wine Paris, Domaine du Chant d'Eole presents the following cuvées :

- Chant d'Eole Brut Blanc de Blancs (100% Chardonnay)
- le Chant d'Eole Brut Rosé (Chardonnay and Pinot Noir)
- le Chant d'Eole Cuvée Millésimée 2018 (100% Chardonnay, min 48 months ageing)

In 2024, the Domaine won several gold medals at competitions such as Chardonnay du Monde, Effervescents du Monde, Vereniging Vlaamse Sommeliers (VVS), Concours Mondial de Bruxelles, Frankfurt International Wine Trophy, Gault&Millau, Sakura Award, and Cata d'Or. Chant d'Éole is recognized as one of the 50 Best Sparkling Wines in the World (50 Great Sparkling Wines Award).

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WINERY 'DOMAINE DU CHENOY'

Founded in 2003, Domaine du Chenoy is a vineyard that stands out for its originality. Spanning around fifteen hectares, it produces wines from unique blends found nowhere else in the world. As a pioneer in Belgium and certified in organic viticulture, the estate uses resistant grape varieties, combining innovation with environmental respect. Its production consists of 70% sparkling wines and 30% still wines.



For its traditional methods, Domaine du Chenoy highlights grape varieties such as Souvignier Gris, Bronner, Johanniter, and Regent.

Vinification is overseen by Jean-Bernard Despatures, a former technical director in Médoc, while blending benefits from the expertise of Eric Boissenot, a renowned Bordeaux oenologist. For sparkling wines, these blends are further refined with the expertise of Bernard Richet, a Champagne oenologist.

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WINERY 'WIJNDOMEIN CRUYSEM'

Bart Bracke and Kathy Declercq founded Wijndomein Cruysem in 2017 out of a deep-rooted passion for wine.

The vineyard, located in the Flemish Ardennes and named after the newly merged municipality, covers 10 hectares and is planted with Chardonnay, Pinot Noir, Pinot Blanc, and Pinot Meunier. The mainly sparkling wines are produced using the traditional method and in an environmentally responsible manner.

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WINERY 'WIJNKASTEEL GENOELS-ELDEREN'

The family estate Wijnkasteel Genoels-Elderen has been cultivating vineyards since 1991. On the nearby south-facing slopes of the Limburg hills, Chardonnay and Pinot Noir vines were planted. Over time, they have developed exceptionally deep roots in the finest loess and marl layers of Droog-Haspengouw.

With extreme vigilance and a lot of manual labor, the Kékkö-van Rennes family, together with a dedicated team, ensures pure and healthy vineyards with rich biodiversity. A strict green harvest and selection process drastically reduces yields, increasing concentration and



character. The centuries-old wild yeasts of Genoels-Elderen Castle give the wines their distinctive aromas. All bottles undergo bottle aging in the castle's cellars, allowing them to blend and reach optimal harmony. The wines, Parels and Levenswaters, are the result of a unique terroir, healthy grapes, hard work, and deep-rooted passion. With 22 hectares, it is one of the largest wine estates in Belgium.

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WINERY 'HOENSHOF'

Prof. Dr. Ghislain Houben began his winemaking journey in the hamlet of Hoenshoven, in Borgloon. In 2002, he planted his first vines on land that had been in his family since 1907. Today, Hoenshof Winery spans 6.5 hectares of vineyards, producing a wide range of wines.

The main goal of Hoenshof Winery is to increase the visibility of Belgian wines. Jerom Houben, who has taken over from



his father, states: "I have been given a great deal of knowledge from a young age. The path to writing our own story is wide open. We don't want to copy and paste—we want to innovate."

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WINERY 'MONT DES ANGES'

The Domaine du Mont des Anges is a Belgian vineyard located across three villages (Nouvelles, Havay, and Ciply), south of Mons in Wallonia. The estate spans 12 hectares of flint and clay-limestone soils, with a south/southeast exposure.

Mont des Anges is known for its carefully selected terroirs, which bring a unique character to both blended and singleparcel cuvées.



The vineyard primarily cultivates

Champagne grape varieties, including Chardonnay, Pinot Noir, Meunier, and Voltis. The grapes are harvested manually at full maturity and slowly pressed to extract the finest juice. Mont des Anges also produces

a special cuvée called «Blanck,» where the grape varieties are pressed together. The wines are then aged for several months before resting in bottles to develop complexity and finesse.

Founded in 2018 by Vincent De Busscher and Laurianne Lejour, the estate is committed to environmental sustainability, practicing viticulture without herbicides or insecticides to preserve both the terroir and consumer health.

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WINERY 'OUD CONYNSBERGH'

Wijndomein Oud Conynsbergh was founded in 2014 and focuses on classic grape varieties such as Pinot Auxerrois, Chardonnay, Pinot Noir, and Gamay. The estate covers 15 hectares of vineyards, which have been certified organic since 2021.

The vineyard operates using organic and biodynamic methods, avoiding herbicides and insecticides while minimizing environmental impact. Every Sunday, the tasting room in the historic Molen van Boechout is open to visitors.
